Environmental Umpire Making Bad Calls



MESSAGE FROM MANAGER ALAN LESLEY

As a big Texas Rangers baseball fan, sometimes I'm upset by an umpire's decision. I know umps are needed to enforce rules of the game, but I've seen quite a few blown calls in my time.

In many ways, umpire mistakes mirror what's going on with government regulation regarding electric utilities and electricity production. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency writes the rulebook for power suppliers, and EPA also serves as an umpire, enforcing the rules of the game.

At CECA, we're committed to keeping your electric bill affordable. So you can understand why I get upset when I see EPA folks make bad calls that put pressure on how much you pay for power.

Over the past two years, Congress debated, but never passed, a comprehensive climate-change bill. Into this void, EPA has stepped forward and has now fielded a team of new regulations. Out of these "players," three could hit electric bills out of the park.

Cross State Air Pollution Rule:
This rule is aimed at capping power plant emissions of sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxides from state to state between Texas and the District of Columbia. EPA claims the rule, when combined with other state and federal measures (such as Maximum Achievable Control Technology rules for mercury emission), will reduce sulfur dioxide emissions from power plants by 71 percent and nitrogen oxides emissions by 52 percent from 2005 levels, but it will cost utilities \$2.8 billion every year to comply.

Currently, these regulation have been stayed by a federal court until April 2012, when they will be ruled on again. While this is a minor victory for utilities, the CSAPR is still a major concern.


Cooling Water Intake Requirements: Power plants use water from lakes or rivers to cool generating equipment. While screens and various components prevent fish and other wildlife from entering water intake pipes, EPA thinks this equipment could be improved. We are expecting a rule proposal, and the impact could be

severe. The North American Electric Reliability Corporation, the nation's bulk power grid watchdog, claims if this rule is strictly enforced, one-third of U.S. electricity capacity may need to be retired.

Coal Ash: To ensure the safe disposal of fly ash and other residues (bottom ash, scrubber sludge and slag) produced by coal-fired power plants (known as coal combustion residual, or CCRs), EPA is considering whether to designate the materials-for the first time—as hazardous waste. Complying with this rule could cost billions and would also halt recycling efforts.

Right now, we use one-third of all fly ash as a Portland cement substitute—and for every ton of concrete replaced by fly ash, a ton of greenhouse gas emissions is avoided. On four prior occasions, most recently under the Clinton administration in 2000, EPA determined CCRs do not warrant regulation as a hazardous waste. Not only did EPA find CCRs rarely, if ever, exhibit a hazardous waste characteristic, the agency also concluded that states can safely manage CCRs under federal non-hazard-ous waste rules.

CECA is committed to keeping you informed about government regulations that will increase the cost of electricity. We're joining co-ops nationally to ask Congress for a much-needed time-out—a two-year moratorium on EPA regulation of carbon



dioxide greenhouse gases. A delay would give lawmakers the opportunity to fashion realistic climate-change legislation that protects you, our members, and keeps electric bills affordable.

ecoPOWR Rebate Program

Rebate Program awarded to CECA through our power supplier, Brazos Electric Cooperative, we are able to offer rebates to our members on approved energy-efficiency measures. This is a program we are extremely happy to offer our members. It has been designed to encourage cooperative members to select cost-effective energy-efficiency measures that will reduce power costs in their homes and businesses. The program will offer rebates when members invest in any of the following rebate opportunities:

HOME ENERGY EVALUATION: This program will offer rebates when members install more efficient lighting, electric heating and cooling equipment, attic insulation, low-flow showerheads, low-flow faucet aerators, water heater blankets for electric water heaters, hot water pipe insulation and commercial lighting upgrades.

COMPACT FLUORESCENT LIGHTING:

Replace existing incandescent bulbs with compact fluorescent lighting.

Qualified Rebate: \$1.25 per bulb

LOW-FLOW SHOWERHEADS: Replace existing showerhead with a new one having a flow rate of less than two gallons per minute.

Qualified Rebate: \$10 per showerhead (electric water heating only)

LOW-FLOW FAUCET AERATORS:

Replace an existing faucet with a unit that has a low-flow rate of 1.5 gallons per minute in bathrooms and less than 2.2 gallons per minute in kitchens.

Qualified Rebate: \$5 per faucet (electric water heating only)

WATER HEATER BLANKET: Install an insulating blanket on your existing electric water heater.

Qualified Rebate: \$15 per electric water heater

PIPE WRAP: Insulate all exposed hot water pipes to reduce heat loss.

Qualified Rebate: \$10 per electric water heater



HEATING AND AIR CONDITIONING

TUNEUP: An annual tuneup includes checking and correcting the unit's refrigerant charge, repairing leaks if required, cleaning and lubricating the blower unit, inspecting and cleaning

of refrigerant coils, replacing filters, thermostat inspection, wiring inspection and duct work inspection.

Qualified Rebate: Up to \$100 per unit (one inspection per 12 months)

CEILING INSULATION UPGRADE: This rebate is available to members living in conventional single-family homes using electric air conditioning and resistance electric heat. Homes with R-8 insulation or less must increase insulation to a minimum of R-38 to qualify for the rebate. A receipt from the contractor performing the upgrade must document existing insulation R-value prior to upgrade and the resulting R-value after the upgrade.

Qualified Rebate: \$275 per residence
HIGH-EFFICIENCY ELECTRIC HEAT

PUMP: Members are encouraged to purchase equipment with better performance to reduce electricity demand and energy consumption. Members requesting a rebate must provide a purchase receipt from a licensed HVAC contractor showing the make and model number of the equipment installed. The equipment efficiency will be certified by the Air-Conditioning Heating and Refrigeration Institute, and a copy of the certification must accompany the sales receipt. This rebate is available to members who replace existing HVAC equipment, as well as new home construction.

Qualified Rebate for 14 SEER Heat Pump: \$100

Qualified Rebate for 15+ SEER Heat Pump: \$200

ENERGY STAR ROOM AIR CONDI- TIONERS: Replace your existing room

COMANCHE ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE

air conditioner with an Energy Star unit with an Energy Efficiency Ratio (EER) of at least 9.8.

Qualified Rebate: \$30 per unit HIGH-EFFICIENCY ELECTRIC WATER HEATER: Replace your existing standalone hot water heater with a highefficiency electric water heater with an energy factor (EF) of .94.

Qualified Rebate: \$25 per electric hot water heater

ENERGY STAR DISHWASHER: Energy Star dishwashers save energy by using both improved technology for the primary wash cycle and less hot water to clean. Replace your existing dishwasher with an Energy Star model with an EF of .65 or higher.

Qualified Rebate: \$15 per unit (electric water heating only)

COMMERCIAL LIGHTING FIXTURE
UPGRADES: A variety of high-efficiency fixtures, ballasts and lamps exist in the market today producing the same output of lumens while consuming fewer watts of electricity. Replacing existing lighting with new high-efficiency lighting will result in a reduction in the number of watts of electricity needed to operate the lighting. Contact the CECA Member Service Department for verification before upgrading.

Qualified Rebate: 20 cents per watt saved per fixture

COMPACT FLUORESCENT LIGHTING PROGRAM: Residential members who sign up for a free energy evaluation performed at their primary residence will be eligible to receive four compact fluorescent lightbulbs for their most frequently used fixtures.

Trimming Trees for Reliability

Trees coming in contact with power lines can cause momentary or extended power outages. In extreme cases, trees can even knock down power lines, causing longer power outages.

CECA has a tree-trimming program in place to help prevent this from happening. By trimming trees that are near or touching power lines and trying to maintain a minimum clearance of 10 feet on all sides of a power line, outages can be reduced within our service territory.

This tree trimming takes place year-round throughout the service territory. But with an estimated regrowth of five to eight years, this is a temporary fix at best.

CECA has a large annual budget for tree growth control that includes trimming as well as removal of trees. Substations with the most outage hours receive top priority, with crews starting at the substation and trimming to



the end of that substation's line. When possible, trees are removed instead of just trimmed in an effort to alleviate the problem, as well as additional expense, for a longer period of time.

If you have a plan in place for removal of trees within 10 feet of

CECA electric lines, you might qualify for some reimbursement. You must obtain details of the program before commencing work. For details, call Director of Member Services Doug Erwin at 1-800-915-2533 or email him at derwin@ceca.coop.
