
Two members are to be elected at this meeting as directors for three-year terms, along with other business that might come before the meeting.

Perhaps you haven't voted in the past because you didn't think you were qualified to weigh in on a particular topic or maybe you simply didn't have time. But doubtless you have an opinion on the issues that affect our community, and CECA wants your particular perspective.


Everyone has valuable experience that informs their decision-making process. Diverse perspectives benefit the whole com-


